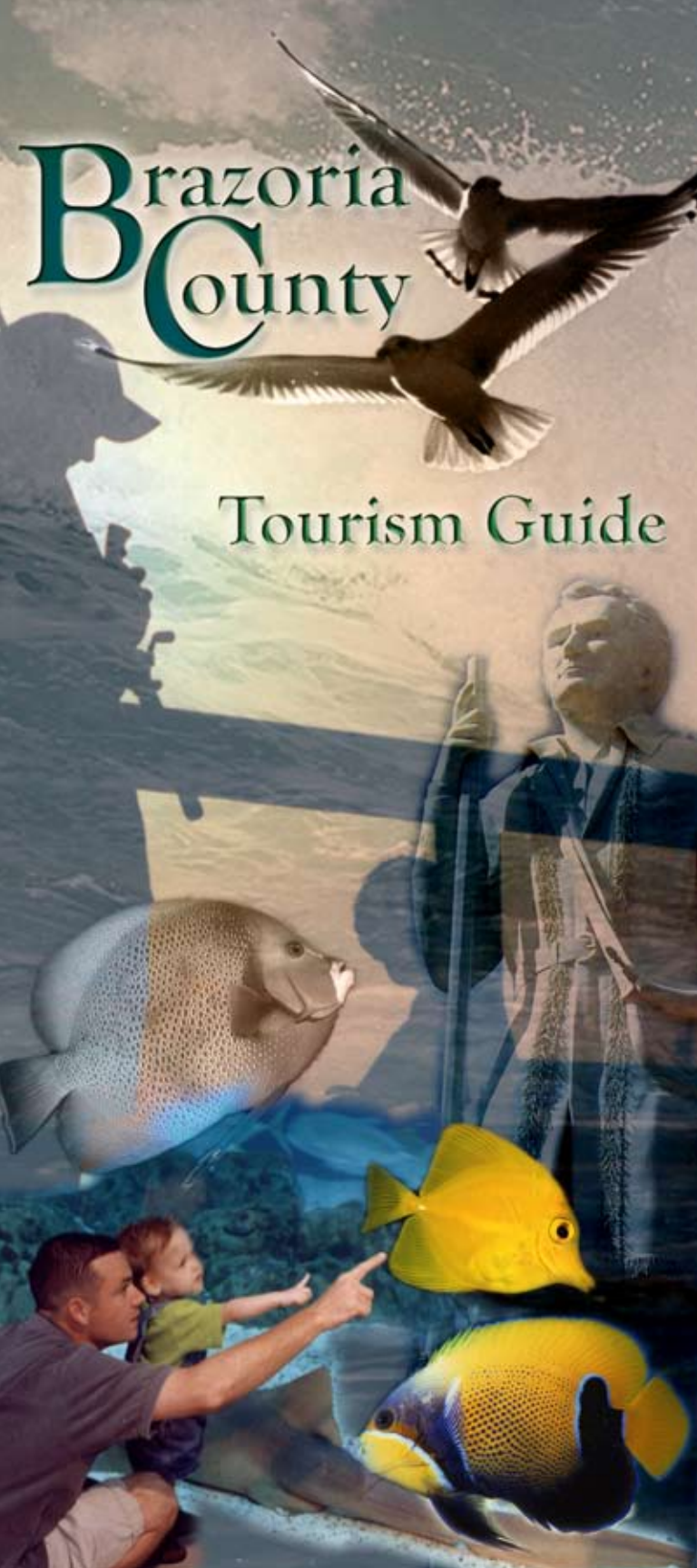

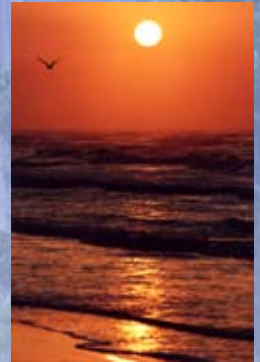

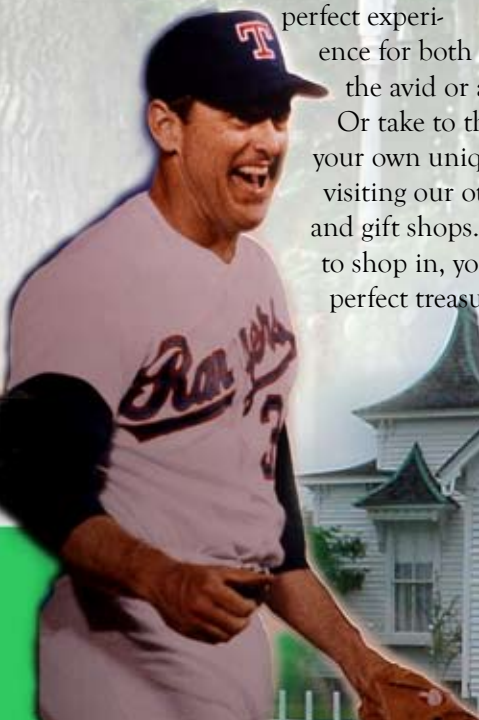
Produce

Rich in History

A 72-foot statue stands as a tribute to Stephen F. Austin, the father of Texas. Stroll around the Texas-shaped lake located in Henry William Munson Park. Travel back in time as you visit the visitor's center and the "Walk of Honor" that pays tribute to Brazoria County residents who have made a significant impact in Brazoria County and the State of Texas.



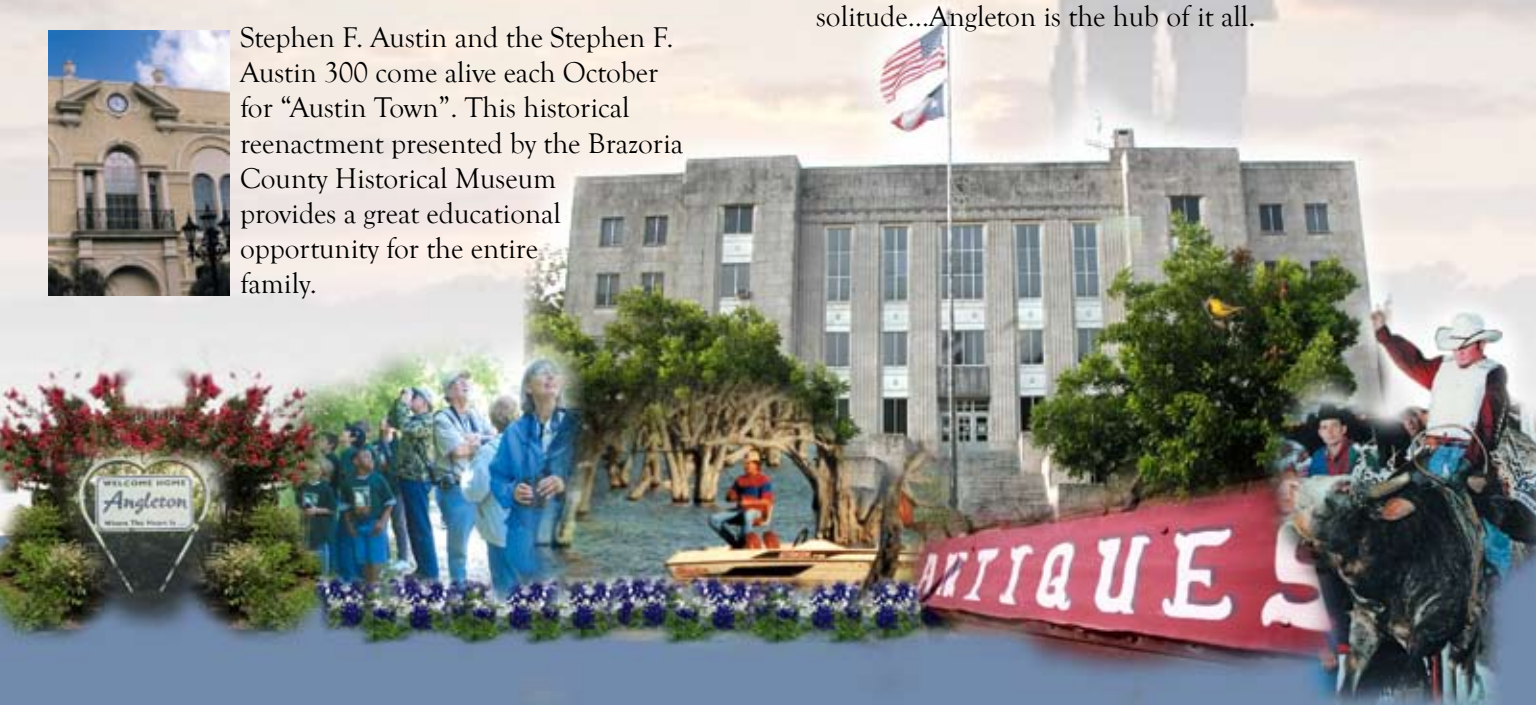
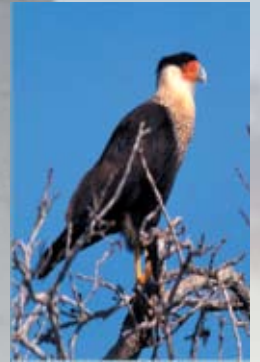
Stephen F. Austin and the Stephen F. Austin 300 come alive each October for "Austin Town". This historical reenactment presented by the Brazoria County Historical Museum provides a great educational opportunity for the entire family.

Rich in Agriculture

Farming and ranching were once the primary source of income for families in the Angleton area. Agriculture is still the way of life for many area residents, with Danbury being the home of one of the largest seed rice producers in the country. The Brazoria County Fair, held in October each year, has a strong agricultural base, providing education in agriculture for area youth.

Rich in Wildlife

With a National Wildlife Refuge to the west and to the south, Angleton is the perfect place to visit for family outings that include fishing, hunting, and birding. The outdoor enthusiast can enjoy fishing in the many lakes that are located in and around the Angleton and Danbury areas, photographing the more than 300 bird species known to the area or just relaxing in the solitude...Angleton is the hub of it all.



BRAZORIA

“The Cradle of Texas”

Brazoria is a friendly place with natural beauty and a world of history.

Take a ride back in time...

Take a relaxing trip down the San Bernard River on an authentic sternwheeler called the Yellow Stone paddle wheeler, named after an early American steamboat that played a major role in the War for Texas independence.

Other activities on the river include fishing for speckled trout, flounder, redfish, or crab to name a few.

However, if you are into more risk-taking activities, then you might enjoy water skiing or knee boarding down the river.

Brazoria’s place in history is as unique as its name. Brazoria was founded by John Austin in 1828 and named by Stephen F. Austin; it served as a port and trading center for the colonist to Texas.



On March 1, 1835 a group of Masons met under a tree to organize the first Masonic Lodge in Texas; the tree is referred to the Masonic Oak Tree and is still standing today.



We also have the first statue in the state honoring the first governor of the provisional state of Texas, Henry Smith.

You will also find a 1933 school that has been restored into a Civic Center/Museum. It contains seemingly endless amounts of history on our city, including information about Dr. Sophie Herzog, the first female doctor in Texas.

The Brazoria Civic Center also has a large auditorium where concerts, plays and other events are held.

Our 23 miles of beaches and gulf teeming with fish and sea life offer great leisure and sport activities for the entire family. The area is the perfect locale to visit overnight, for a weekend or even for a week.

The eight cities that make up Brazosport link a large portion of Brazoria County. They include: Clute, Freeport, Jones Creek, Lake Jackson, Oyster Creek, Quintana, Richwood and Surfside Beach. Each of these cities are located within a few minutes of one another.

The Lake Jackson Historical Museum chronicles the history of the area through interactive exhibits from the plantation era to modern industry.

WEST COLUMBIA

First Capital of the Republic of Texas

East Columbia - West Columbia - Birthplace of Texas

East Columbia (originally named Marion) is one of the oldest Anglo settlements in Texas. It was established by Josiah H. Bell in 1824 on the third land grant issued by Stephen F. Austin.

Beginning as a major river port and commercial center for Austin's original colony, Marion (or Bell's Landing as it was called) continued as a major commercial and transportation center until railroads put steamboats out of business around 1900.

Columbia was established in 1826, also by Josiah H. Bell. The Republic of Texas was born at Columbia (now called West Columbia) on October 3, 1836, with the inauguration of Sam Houston as the Republic's first president, Stephen F. Austin as secretary of state, and the swearing-in of the Republic's first congress.

How the Brazos River Got Its Name

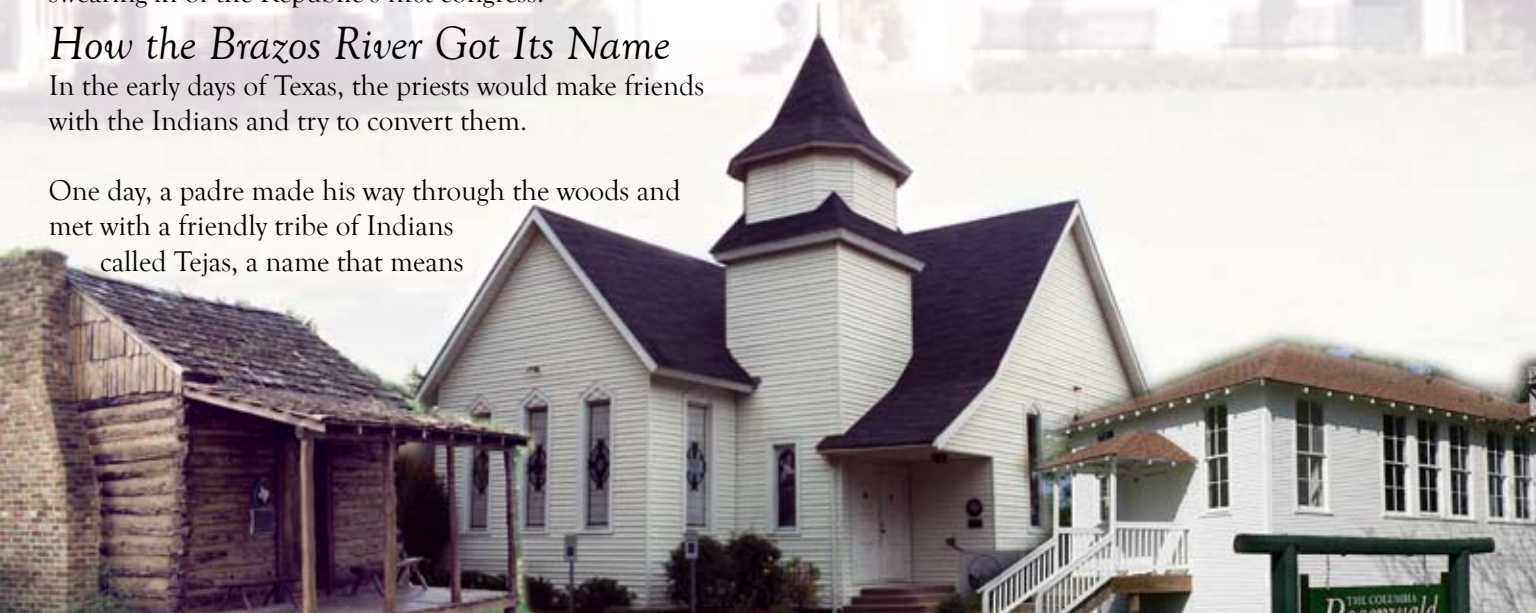
In the early days of Texas, the priests would make friends with the Indians and try to convert them.

One day, a padre made his way through the woods and met with a friendly tribe of Indians called Tejas, a name that means

"friend". As they continued through the woods, they were set upon from behind by the Karankawas, a fierce tribe of Indians. The priest and his Indians began to run through the woods as fast as they could, but the Karankawas were bigger and stronger and could run faster. The priest and his little band were about to give up hope when they crossed a small rise and came out onto a river bank. This river was called Tockanhono, an Indian name meaning "mighty waters of the Tejas". It was deep and wide and the priest couldn't swim, and he doubted if the Tejas' could either. He had no choice but to plunge in and so did the Indians. At that moment a miracle happened: The waters rolled back and let them pass to the other side.

Once on the other side they looked back and saw the Karankawas crossing the river. Just then another miracle happened: A mighty tide swept in from the sea and the Karankawas were carried away and never heard from again. The priest and the Indians fell to their knees to thank God. The priest stood and held out his arms and declared from here on out and forevermore, men shall know these waters as "Los Brazos de Dios", the arms of God.

This is the legend of how the Brazos River got its name.
